Of Silhouettes and Souls

Nilofer and I began the podcast by talking about a topic the show doesn't often come across: arranged marriage. Her traditional Muslim Indian family wanted Nilofer to enter an arranged marriage, though she wanted higher education for herself -- which led to a falling out with her family. That difficult experience left her with a thought that's been helpful for her in business and life: sometimes people don't see you as you (a "soul"), they only see you as a category (a "silhouette"). In business that could be too young, wears glasses, or any number of categories.

Using Your Past

Nilofer's story is one of courage and bravery. It was leaving her family that helped her develop a certain "muscle" by which she was able to see herself as worthy even when other people did not, and she's been able to pass along this lesson to others.

When people are faced with a tough decision, she recommends they first realize that either horn of the dilemma is going to be sharp. However, when faced what's right for you versus what fits into what other people expect of you, she says the latter will always be the much harder choice. Her advice is effective because her experience has depth and weight.

"Every single one of us has some power," said Nilofer. Her advice is to use your power to prop up others. This is a way to be of service to others while helping combat bias. Her suggestion starts with asking yourself these two important questions:

- Who could I serve to make sure their voice gets propped up?

From there, take action accordingly.
